A message from Bev Slough, School Board Member, District 1

It has been a pleasure to welcome a normal new school year! I am so glad that parents and community members have access to our schools again and such things as football games and plays are able to accommodate full capacity. Both students and teachers alike have welcomed the return to school as usual.

That said, we have certainly faced challenges this year. The staff shortages that have been experienced all over Florida have finally caught up with us in St. Johns County. We still have teaching positions as well as support staff jobs that remain unfilled. We are working hard to have a teacher in place for every class. Our Human Resources department has reached out to our intern students from UNF, Flagler College and other colleges to encourage them to join our substitute pool to give them experience in the classroom and to provide introductions to various principals around the county. In addition, they are providing preparation for the certification test so that students can graduate with that already accomplished, thus ready to go to work as teachers. In addition, job fairs are being held at several colleges of education and outreach to the community at large is ongoing.

We also continue to seek paraprofessionals to fill vacancies at nearly all our schools. To be a para at a Title I school requires an associates degree (60 hours of college credit), but that requirement has been lifted at non Title 1 schools to encourage more applicants. Hourly rates have been increased to a minimum of \$15 for all these positions, with extra pay for several of them.

Another area where we are experiencing personnel shortage is bus operators. As our district grows (we currently have almost 50,000 students), the demand for bus operators and additional bus routes increases. We are currently short so many operators that we have had to stop school field trips until we have more drivers. On October 1, another opportunity for people to come drive a bus and see what that is like will be held. When we did this last year, we were able to hire some new drivers from those who took advantage of the opportunity.

If you or someone you know has a desire to work for St. Johns County Schools, there is ample opportunity to do so. Please visit the district webpage, www.stjohns.k12.fl.us, to see the current openings.

Even with all the growing pains, our children are still deeply engaged in their learning. As I visit schools and classrooms, I see eager learners taking advantage of all the opportunities that our schools afford them. The first interim grades have been released, and I encourage all parents to visit Home Access Center to check their children's progress. If your child is struggling in an area, please reach out to the teacher to create a plan for his/her success going forward.

The School Board recently approved a \$1.2 billion dollar budget for this school year. Our district is the largest employer in the county, runs the largest transportation service and the largest food service department in our area. The school district is a large business, with over 6000 employees who are all focused on a quality education for St. Johns County students.

This year is our accreditation year. You may have received a survey from your child's school with questions about the education being delivered in our district. I encourage you to complete the survey because it will provide valuable information both to our district and to the accreditation team that will visit later in the year.
